

BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES
SEMINOLE CITY COUNCIL
August 11, 2026

The Business Meeting of the Seminole City Council was held on Tuesday, August 11, 2026, at 6:00 p.m., in City Hall, City Council Chambers, 9199 - 113th Street North, Seminole, Florida.

Mayor Waters called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Vice Mayor Chris Burke provided the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENT

Mayor Leslie Waters, Vice Mayor Chris Burke, Councilor Thom Barnhorn, Councilor Ray Beliveau, Councilor Al Shields, Councilor Trish Springer, Councilor Kadi Hendricks Tubbs, City Manager Ann Toney-Deal, Attorney Tom Trask substituting for City Attorney Jay Daigneault, and City Clerk Ann Marie Mancuso. Not Present: City Attorney Jay Daigneault.

PRESENTATIONS

A. Sandy Holloway Proclamation.

Mayor Waters recognized Seminole Historical Museum Board/Charter Member Sandy Holloway with a Proclamation declaring August 11, 2026, as Sandy Holloway Day in the City of Seminole. In addition to being a Board/Charter Member of the Seminole Historical Society, Ms. Holloway was also an instrumental part of many causes in the City.

1. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Tom Reid, Vice Mayor of South Pasadena, also Board Member and Seminole Representative on the Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority (PSTA) spoke about the proposed bus route cuts that the PSTA is considering. One of the routes (Route 58) directly affects the City of Seminole. This route in particular services the Seminole City Center, and St. Petersburg College, Seminole Campus, and the Seminole Community Library. Public Hearings are scheduled for August 19, 2026, at 10:30 a.m. and August 26, 2026, at 9:00 a.m.

Councilor Beliveau also withdrew his name as a candidate for the upcoming PSTA Board Seat.

ALL IN FAVOR. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

3. ACTION ITEMS

- A. Authorize the Kiwanis Breakfast Club of Seminole to hold its 12th Annual Field of Honor at City Hall and Related Requests.

David Green, Secretary of the Kiwanis Breakfast Club of Seminole, spoke on behalf of the Club to ask permission to have its 12th Annual Field of Honor Ceremony in City Hall Council Chambers on Monday, November 9, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., and the Field of Flags Display in front of City Hall from November 7, 2026, through December 5, 2026.

Motion made by Councilor Shields, seconded by Councilor Barnhorn to approve the request from the Kiwanis Breakfast Club of Seminole to hold its 12th Annual Field of Honor at City Hall during the month of November 2026, its ceremony on November 9, 2026, approve accommodations with tables, chairs, and to approve City Sign Permits and waive related fees for event signage.

ALL IN FAVOR. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

5. CITY MANAGER REPORT

- A. Community Policing Report.

Community Policing Officer, Deputy Travis Stanton provided an update reminder that school is now in session and to be mindful of students and buses. Deputy Stanton stated that there was an individual that was a member of the Seminole Recreation Center, and staff noticed signs that the individual was homeless. Deputy Stanton brought him to Pinellas Safe Harbor. The individual was very open to all of the assistance that Pinellas Safe Harbor provides, and this gentleman is now going out on job interviews.

Deputy Stanton followed up on a request by Vice Mayor Burke seeking information on how many Police calls Valor Preserve has received since May. Deputy Stanton stated that there have been four (4) calls since May 1, 2026. Lastly, Deputy Stanton advised that he did updates on gate codes throughout Seminole.

B. Schedule Veterans Memorial Advisory Committee Meeting for Tuesday, August 25, 2026.

City Manager Toney-Deal stated that the schematics of the Veterans Memorial needs to be finalized and asked Council if they and the Advisory Committee would like to meet on Tuesday, August 25, 2026, immediately following the Council meeting. It was the consensus of the Council to have the Veterans Memorial Advisory Committee Meeting on Tuesday, August 25, 2026, immediately following the Council Meeting.

C. Discuss Proposed FY 2027 PSTA Route Cuts.

City Manager Toney-Deal mirrored what Vice Mayor Reid talked about in his Public Comment in reference to PSTA cutting the Seminole Route #58. She also stated that she spoke to the Provost of the St. Petersburg College - Seminole Campus, Dr. Lisa Borzewski. Provost Borzewski informed her that a representative from the College would be speaking at both Public Hearings. City Manager Toney-Deal stated that it would be nice to see a member of Council speak at the two (2) hearings as well. Councilor Beliveau and Councilor Shields both offered to represent the City and attend both hearings and will speak against the Route #58 cut. City Manager Toney-Deal stated that City of Seminole property owners contributed an estimated 1.7 million dollars to PSTA.
